The Afghanistan-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 19)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 18,116 Afghanistan-born persons in Victoria (38.7% of Australia's total), ranked 19th among the overseasborn communities in Victoria. The Afghanistan-born increased by 82.2% (8,171) from 9,945 persons in 2011. Most of the Afghanistan-born live in the metropolitan LGAs of Casey (47.1%), Greater Dandenong (26.5%) and Brimbank (2.6%). A small proportion live in the regional LGAs of Greater Shepparton (4.2%) and Greater Geelong (2.8%).

The Afghanistan-born reflected a young to adult and maturing age profile: 35.6% were aged 25 years and below; 45.0% were aged 26-44 years; 16.7% were aged 45-64 years; and 2.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 31 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 154 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 20,467 persons identified with Afghani ancestry. Most of them were born in Afghanistan (64.1%), Australia (21.7%) and Pakistan (6.0%). Only 8.3% of the Afghanistan-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 8.1% arrived in 1996-2000; 14.2% arrived in 2001-2005; 23.5% arrived in 2006-2010; and 43.2% arrived in 2011-2016.

The Afghanistan-born speak a variety of languages: Dari (45.6%), Hazaraghi (34.3%), Pashto (8.8%) and Persian (6.1%). Of those who speak a language other than English, 31.9% speak English not well/not at all. Most (91.5%) of the Afghanistan-born follow Islam. Half (49.3%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The educational levels of the Afghanistan-born are lower than for total Victoria. Only 7.9% have a bachelor degree or higher, 5.9% have an advanced diploma and diploma and 10.0% have a certificate, compared to 24.4%, 9.2% and 14.4% for total Victoria. More of the Afghanistan-born (47.3%) have school education only and 22.6% have no educational attainment, compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Afghanistan-born at 51.1% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 16.8% is higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Afghanistan-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (5.5%), professionals (7.2%) and clerical and administrative workers (4.3%), compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 13.1% for Victoria. More of them are technicians and trades workers (35.8%), machinery operators and drivers (9.9%) and labourers (15.4%), compared to 13.1%, 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Afghanistan-born are also different from total Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (10.5%) and construction (27.9%), compared to 7.8% and 8.3% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in accommodation and food services (3.7%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (4.7%) and education and training (3.6%), compared to 6.6%, 11.4% and 8.6% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Afghanistan-born is different from that for total Victoria. More of them (17.8%) receive nil income and 31.4% receive \$1-\$399, compared to 9.7% and 20.1% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (5.7%) and \$2,000 or more (1.0%), compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
