The Argentina-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 63)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 4,010 Argentina-born persons in Victoria (30.0% of Australia's total), ranked 63rd among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Argentina-born increased by 10.2% (370) from 3,640 persons in 2011. They are well distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with slight concentrations in the LGAs of Casey (8.2%), Brimbank (7.7%), Greater Dandenong (4.8%), Moreland (4.4%) and Melton (4.4%).

The Argentina-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 7.3% were aged 25 years and below: 34.5% were aged 26-44 years; 35.8% were aged 45-64 years; and 22.4% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 48 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 90 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 3,805 persons identified with Argentinian ancestry. Most were born in Australia (54.4%) and Argentina (40.5%), with small numbers born in the USA, Israel and England. Most (69.2%) of the Argentina-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 2.6% arrived in 1996-2000; 7.2% arrived in 2001-2005; 5.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 13.1% arrived in 2011-2016.

The Argentina-born speak mainly Spanish (73.5%) and Italian (4.4%) at home. More than half (58.7%) of the Argentina-born are Catholic and small numbers follow a variety of Christian faiths; 22.2% have no religion. Four-fifths (79.2%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.



Distribution of Argentina-born, Top 5 LGAs: 2016 Census



Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Argentina-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria: 29.3% have a bachelor degree or higher and 34.1% have school education only, compared to 24.3% and 38.7% for total Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Argentina-born at 66.7% is higher than that for total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate is the same as for total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Argentina-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria: 13.2% are managers, 25.4% are professionals, 14.0% are technicians and trade workers, compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 13.1% for Victoria. Less of the Argentina-born are sales workers (6.9%) and machinery operators and drivers (4.4%), compared to Victoria (9.7% and 5.8%).

The industry of employment patterns for the Argentina-born are also similar to those for total Victoria. More of the Argentina-born are employed in manufacturing (9.5%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (16.3%) and education and training (9.3%), compared with Victoria (7.8%, 11.4% and 8.6%). Less of them are in wholesale and retail trade (11.1%) and in healthcare and social assistance (11.5%), compared to 13.4% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Argentina-born is slightly higher than for total Victoria. More of them receive incomes of \$800 and above: 17.5% receive \$800-\$1,249 and 25.1% receive \$1,250 or more, compared to 16.7% and 21.1% for Victoria.
