The Belarus-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 100)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 846 Belarus-born persons in Victoria (49.6% of Australia's total), ranked 100th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Belarus-born decreased by 5.5% (49) from 895 persons in 2011. They are concentrated in a number of LGAs in Metropolitan Melbourne: Glen Eira (32.4%), Kingston (11.0%), Port Phillip (10.8%), Bayside (7.2%) and Stonnington (6.1%).

The Belarus-born reflected an adult to ageing profile: 7.2% were aged 25 years and below; 36.8% were aged 26-44 years; 25.0% were aged 45-64 years; and 30.1% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 50 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 70 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for Victoria.

There were 1,003 persons identified with Belarusian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (38.0%) and Belarus (37.2%). More than half (58.6%) of the Belarus-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 11.3% arrived in 1996-2000; 6.9% arrived in 2001-2005; 10.6% arrived in 2006-2010; and 11.3% arrived in 2011-2016.

Four-fifths (80.7%) of the Belarus-born speak Russian at home; 11.8% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 21.1% speak English not well/not at all. The Belarus-born follow a variety of religions: 33.0% follow Judaism and 18.1% are Eastern Orthodox, 5.9% are Christian not further defined and 5.3% are Catholic; 28.8% have no religion. Most (83.3%) of the Belarus-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Belarus-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of them (37.3%) have a bachelor degree and 10.3% have a postgraduate degree, compared to 16.5% and 5.4% for Victoria. Less of them (18.9%) have school education only, compared to 38.7% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Belarus-born at 55.5% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 3.9% is also lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Belarus-born are similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. More of them (40.9%) work as professionals compared to 23.3% for Victoria. Less of the Belarus-born are sales workers (5.7%) and labourers (3.0%), compared to 9.7% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Belarus-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of the Belarus-born are employed in professional, scientific, technical and administration (18.2%), health care and social assistance (16.6%) and finance and insurance (9.5%), compared to 11.4%, 12.5% and 3.9% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in manufacturing (5.9%) and wholesale and retail trade (9.8%), compared to 7.8% and 13.4% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Belarus-born is fairly different from total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (25.0%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (17.2%) and \$2,000 or more (8.9%), compared to 20.1%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
