## The Brazil-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 67)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 3,828 Brazil-born persons in Victoria (13.9% of Australia's total), ranked 67<sup>th</sup> among the oversea-born communities in Victoria. The Brazil -born increased by 90.1% (1,814) from 2,014 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with significant concentrations in LGAs of Melbourne (16.4%) and Port Phillip (9.8%), and minor concentrations in Stonnington (5.4%); Moreland (5.1%) and Glen Eira (4.5%).

The Brazil-born reflected a young to mature age profile: 20.5% were aged 25 years and below; 62.4% were aged 26-44 years; 14.3% were aged 45-64 years; and 2.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 33 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 84 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 3,102 persons identified with Brazilian ancestry; most of them were born in Brazil (63.9%) and Australia (27.9%). Only 12.7% of the Brazil-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 3.8% arrived in 1996-2000; 7.9% arrived in 2001-2005; 22.1% arrived in 2006-2010; and 48.9% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Brazil-born speak Portuguese (78.8%). Forty-three per cent the Brazil-born are Catholic; 32.6% have no religion. Just over one-third (36.2%) of the Brazil-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.







## **Economic characteristics**

The educational levels of the Brazil-born are higher than for total Victoria: 39.5% have a bachelor degree and 14.0% have a postgraduate degree, compared to 16.5% and 5.4% for total Victoria. Over a quarter (27.5%) have a certificate or school education only, compared to 53.1% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Brazil-born at 75.6% is higher than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 11.1% is also higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Brazil-born are fairly different from those of total Victoria: 28.4% work as professionals; 15.9% are community and personal service workers and 13.6% are labourers, compared to 23.3%, 10.6% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Brazil-born are fairly similar to total Victoria. The exceptions are that more of the Brazil-born are employed in accommodation and food services (15.0%), and professional, scientific, technical and administration (21.3%), compared to 6.6% and 11.4% for total Victoria. Less of the Brazil-born are employed in construction (2.9%) and health care and social assistance (9.8%) compared to 8.3% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly income distribution pattern of the Brazil-born is fairly different from total Victoria: 13.6% receive nil income (9.7% for Victoria) and 14.6% receive \$1-\$399 (20.1% for Victoria). More of the Brazil-born receive \$400-\$799 (28.4%) and \$2,000 or more (11.2%), compared to 23.1% and 7.5% for Victoria.
