The Cyprus-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 44)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 7,574 Cyprus-born persons in Victoria (44.7% of Australia's total), ranked 44th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Cyprus-born decreased by 7.4% (105) from 8,179 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Brimbank (17.7%), Hume (9.0%), Whittlesea (8.1%), Melton (5.8%) and Kingston (5.1%).

The Cyprus-born reflected a significant ageing profile: 2.6% were aged 25 years and below; 8.8% were aged 26-44 years; 42.1% were aged 45-64 years; and 46.6% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 63 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 91 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for Victoria.

There were 12,071 persons identified with Cypriot ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (65.9%) and Cyprus (28.0%). The majority (91.3%) of the Cyprus-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 1.6% arrived in 1996- 2000; 1.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 0.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 2.1% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Cyprus-born speak Greek (59.7%) and Turkish (25.3%). Of those who speak a language other than English, 20.7% speak English not well/not at all. Most of Cyprus-born follow Eastern Orthodox (63.3%) and Islam (21.0%). The majority (93.5%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Cyprus-born are lower than those for total Victoria: 58.5% have school education only and 4.8% have no educational attainment, compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for Victoria. Only 10.1% have a bachelor degree or higher (24.3% for total Victoria).

The labour force participation rate of the Cyprus-born at 37.2% is much lower than for total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 5.5% is lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Cyprus-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some minor differences. More of them are working as managers (15.6%), technicians and trades workers (16.3%), machinery operators and drivers (9.4%) and labourers (12.0%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 13.1%, 5.8% and 9.0%). Less of the Cyprus-born are working as professionals (16.3%) and community and personal service workers (7.4%), compared to Victoria (23.3% and 10.6%).

The industry of employment patterns for the Cyprus-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. The exceptions are that more of them are employed in manufacturing (11.9%), construction (11.4%) and transport, postal and warehousing (7.1%), compared to 7.8%, 8.3% and 4.8% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in healthcare and social assistance (8.7%) compared to Victoria (12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Cyprus-born is fairly different from total Victoria. More of the Cyprus-born receive \$1-\$399 (36.9%) and \$400-\$799 (25.8%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria. A quarter (25.5%) receive \$800 or more (37.8% for Victoria).
