The Czech Republic-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 85)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 1,595 Czech Republic-born persons in Victoria (20.7% of Australia's total), ranked 85th among the overseasborn communities in Victoria. The Czech Republic-born decreased by 4.0% (67) from 1,662 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with moderate concentrations in the LGAs of Casey (7.3%), Kingston (5.6%), Glen Eira (5.3%), Whitehorse (3.9%) and Boroondara (3.8%).

The Czech Republic-born reflected an ageing profile: 5.0% were aged 25 years and below; 29.2% were aged 26-44 years; 26.8% were aged 45-64 years; and 39.4% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 58 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 79 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for Victoria.

There were 6,002 persons identified with Czech ancestry. Most were born in Australia (57.7%) and in the Czech Republic (22.7%). Almost three-quarters (72.9%) of the Czech Republic-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 4.8% arrived in 1996-2000; 4.6% arrived in 2001-2005; 5.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 8.8% arrived in 2011-2016.

Over half (52.5%) speak Czech (52.5%) and 38.7% speak English only. Just over a third of the Czech Republic-born (36.4%) are Catholic and 1.6% follow Judaism; 45.6% have no religion. Most (82.4%) of the Czech Republic-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Czech Republic-born are higher than those for total Victoria. 28.7% have a bachelor degree or higher and 34.7% have a certificate or advanced diploma and diploma, compared to 24.3% and 23.6% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Czech Republic-born at 50.8% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 6.2% is fairly similar to total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Czech Republic-born differ slightly from those for total Victoria. More of them work as professionals (28.6%), technicians and trades workers (15.8%) and community and personal service workers (12.6%), compared to Victoria (23.3%, 13.1% and 10.6%). Less of the Czech Republic-born are sales workers (5.6%), machinery operators and drivers (3.4%) and labourers (6.4%), compared to Victoria (9.7%, 5.8% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns for the Czech Republic-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. The exceptions are that more of them are employed in professional, scientific, technical and administration (15.4%), healthcare and social assistance (14.7%) and arts, recreation and other services (7.1%), compared to 11.4%, 12.5% and 5.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Czech Republic-born is fairly similar to that for total Victoria. Slightly more of them receive \$1-\$399 (23.5%) and \$400-\$799 (29.9%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria. Less of them (15.4%) receive \$800-\$1,249 (16.7% for Victoria).
