The Ethiopia-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 48)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 6,368 Ethiopia-born persons in Victoria (54.0% of Australia's total), ranked 48th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Ethiopia-born increased by 41.9% (1,879) from 4,489 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with significant concentrations in the LGAs of Wyndham (20.1%), Brimbank (15.2%), Moonee Valley (8.1%), Maribyrnong (7.9%) and Greater Dandenong (6.8%).

The Ethiopia-born reflected a young to mature age profile: 24.5% were aged 25 years and below; 44.9% were aged 26-44 years; 27.9% were aged 45-64 years; and 2.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 37 years, similar to total Victoria. The gender ratio was 90 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 7,383 persons identified with Ethiopian ancestry. Most were born in Ethiopia (56.0%) and Australia (31.9%). Almost one-fifth (17.6%) of the Ethiopian-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 12.2% arrived in 1996-2000; 18.4% arrived in 2001-2005; 21.6% arrived in 2006-2010; and 26.4% arrived in 2011-2016.

The Ethiopia-born speak Amharic (42.3%), Oromo (20.9%), Tigrinya (11.2%) and Somali (3.4%). Of those who speak a language other than English, 12.5% speak English not well/not at all. The Ethiopia-born follow a variety of religions: Islam (30.3%), Oriental Orthodox (24.1%), Christian not further defined (11.8%), Eastern Orthodox (9.7%) and other Protestant (4.7%). Two-thirds (65.7%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 53.8% for the total overseas-born in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Ethiopia-born are lower than for total Victoria: 13.2% have a bachelor degree or higher and 4.6% have no educational attainment, compared to 24.3% and 1.0% for Victoria. More of the Ethiopia-born have an advanced diploma and diploma (9.0%) and a certificate (18.3%), compared to 9.2% and 14.4% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Ethiopia-born at 62.4% is fairly similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 17.2% is much higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Ethiopia-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (4.1%), professionals (11.5%), technicians and trades workers (5.2%) and clerical and administrative workers (5.5%), compared to total Victoria (13.5%, 23.3%, 13.1% and 13.3%). More of the Ethiopia-born work as community and personal service workers (28.7%), machinery operators and drivers (18.5%) and labourers (18.9%), compared to Victoria (10.6%, 5.8% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns for the Ethiopia-born are also different from those for total Victoria. Less of them are employed in construction (1.3%), wholesale and retail trade (6.7%) and education and training (3.1%), compared to 8.3%, 13.4% and 8.6% for Victoria. More of them are employed in transport, postal and warehousing (14.4%) and healthcare and social assistance (32.7%), compared to Victoria (4.8% and 12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Ethiopia-born is different from total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (28.8%) and \$400-\$799 (28.7%), compared to Victoria (20.1% and 23.1%). Less of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (6.3%) and \$2,000 or more (1.8%), compared to Victoria (13.6% and 7.5%).
