The Finland-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 92)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 1,244 Finland-born persons in Victoria (16.1% of Australia's total), ranked 92nd among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Finland-born increased by 1.3% (16) from 1,228 persons in 2011. They are well distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with slight concentrations in the LGAs of Port Phillip (5.0%), Hume (4.9%), Wyndham (4.7%) and Monash (3.6%). A significant proportion live in regional Victoria (16.8%) and in the regional LGA of Greater Geelong (4.7%).

The Finland-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 10.3% were aged 25 years and below; 21.8% were aged 26-44 years; 32.4% were aged 45-64 years; and 35.4% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 58 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 62 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for Victoria.

There were 4,022 persons identified with Finnish ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (61.1%) and Finland (28.5%). Two-thirds (64.5%) of the Finland-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 3.9% arrived in 1996-2000; 5.4% arrived in 2001-2005; 8.7% arrived in 2006-2010; and 15.4% arrived in 2011-2016.

Over half (58.2%) of the Finland-born speak Finnish. The Finland-born follow Lutheran (44.3%), Pentecostal (3.4%), Christian not further defined (3.2%) and Catholic (1.5%); 30.5% have no religion. Almost two-thirds (65.9%) of the Finland-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 53.8% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The educational levels of the Finland-born are fairly similar to total Victoria. The exception is that 10.5% have a postgraduate degree compared to 5.4% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Finland-born at 49.1% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 6.0% is slightly lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Finland-born are fairly different from those for total Victoria. More of the Finland-born are professionals (29.7%), community and personal service workers (12.0%) and clerical and administrative workers (15.3%), compared to 23.3%, 10.6% and 13.3% for Victoria. Less of them are technicians and trade workers (9.1%), sales workers (5.1%) and labourers (7.1%), compared to 13.1%, 9.7% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Finland-born are slightly different from those for total Victoria. More them are employed in manufacturing (9.5%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (14.2%), education and training (10.9%) and healthcare and social assistance (15.7%), compared to 7.8%, 11.4%, 8.6% and 12.5% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in construction (6.4%), wholesale and retail trade (10.8%) and public administration and safety (3.6%), compared to 8.3%, 13.4%, 11.4% and 5.3% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern of the Finland-born is slightly different from total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (25.1%) and \$400-\$799 (29.1%) than Victoria (20.1% and 23.1%). Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (13.2%) and \$1,250-\$1,999 (11.1%) than Victoria (13.6% and 7.5%).
