The Germany-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 12)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 26,308 Germany-born persons in Victoria (25.6% of Australia's total), ranked 12th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Germany-born decreased by 6.1% (1,713) from 28,021 persons in 2011. They are well distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with minor concentrations in the LGAs of: Knox (4.3%), Yarra Ranges (4.2%), Casey (3.9%) and Brimbank (3.6%). A significant proportion live in the regional LGA of Greater Geelong (5.1%) and in the rest of regional Victoria (19.4%).

The Germany-born reflected an ageing profile: 6.8% were aged 25 years and below; 15.3% were aged 26-44 years; 22.3% were aged 45-64 years; and 55.6% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 67 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 91 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 201,850 persons identified with German ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (79.6%) and Germany (9.7%). Threequarters (74.7%) of the German-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 3.9% arrived in 1996-2000; 4.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 5.9% arrived in 2006-2010; and 7.8% arrived in 2011-2016.

Over a third (36.7%) of the Germany-born speak German; 53.7% speak English only. The Germany-born are mainly Catholic (26.2%), Lutheran (15.3%) and Anglican (3.8%); 31.0% have no religion. Two-thirds (68.8%) of the Germany-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The educational levels of the Germany-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. More of them have a postgraduate degree (8.1%) and a certificate (19.9%), compared to 5.4% and 14.4% for total Victoria. Less of them have a bachelor degree (12.7%) and school education only (32.4%), compared to 16.5% and 38.7% for total Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Germany-born at 41.0% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 5.0% is also lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Germany-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of them (17.1%) work as managers and 29.9% work as professionals, compared to 13.5% and 23.3% for Victoria. Less of the Germany-born are technicians and trades workers (10.9%), sales workers (6.5%) and labourers (7.1%), compared to 13.1%, 9.7% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Germany-born are also different from total Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (9.5%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (15.4%) and education and training (10.9%), compared to 7.8%, 11.4% and 8.6% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in construction (5.6%), wholesale and retail trade (11.6%) and accommodation and food services (5.1%) than Victoria (8.3%, 13.4% and 6.6%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Germany-born is lower than for total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (25.5%) and \$400-\$799 (30.9%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria. Less of the Germany-born receive \$800-\$1,249 (13.1%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (10.5%) and \$2,000 or more (8.1%) than Victoria (16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5%).
