The Hungary-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 56)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 4,984 Hungary-born persons in Victoria (27.8% of Australia's total), ranked 56th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Hungary-born decreased by 10.5% (582) from 5,566 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Casey (9.7%), Glen Eira (8.8%), Knox (5.6%), Monash (5.0%) and Whitehorse (4.1%). A significant proportion (13.3%) live in regional Victoria.

The Hungary-born reflected a significant ageing profile: 3.4% were aged 25 years and below; 13.9% were aged 26-44 years; 22.3% were aged 45-64 years; and 60.4% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 69 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 87 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for Victoria.

There were 23,092 persons identified with Hungarian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (59.2%) and Hungary (19.9%). Four-fifths (81.3%) of the Hungary-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 2.0% arrived in 1996-2000; 1.9% arrived in 2001-2005; 4.6% arrived in 2006-2010; and 6.7% arrived in 2011-2016.

Three-fifths (59.8%) of the Hungary-born speak Hungarian; 35.0% spoke English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 7.1% speak English not well/not at all. The Hungary-born follow a variety of religions: Catholic (52.2%), Judaism (7.2%), Presbyterian/Reform (6.3%), Christian not further defined (1.8%) and Lutheran (1.5%); 19.3% have no religion. Most (88.1%) of the Hungary-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Hungary-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. Less of the Hungary-born have a bachelor degree (12.4%) compared to 16.5% for Victoria. More of them have a certificate (18.6%) than Victoria (14.4%).

The labour force participation rate of the Hungary-born at 34.8% is much lower than for total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 5.5% is also lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Hungary-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. The minor differences are that more of the Hungary-born work as professionals (25.9%), and machinery operators and drivers (6.4%), compared to 23.3% and 5.8% for Victoria. Less of them work as sales workers (7.8%) and labourers (6.7%), compared to 9.7% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns for the Hungary-born are also fairly similar to those for total Victoria. The exceptions are that more of them are employed in manufacturing (10.2%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (13.1%) and healthcare and social assistance (15.3%), compared to 7.8%, 11.4% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Hungary-born is lower than total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (28.2%) and \$400-\$799 (30.7%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (12.6%) and \$1.250 or more (14.5%), compared to 16.7% and 21.1% for Victoria.
