The Iran-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 24)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 16,627 Iran-born persons in Victoria (28.6% of Australia's total), ranked 24th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Iran-born increased by 123.3% (9,181) from 7,446 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of: Manningham (11.8%), Whittlesea (10.0%), Whitehorse (5.9%), Greater Dandenong (5.5%) and Casey (5.3%).

The Iran-born reflected a young to balanced age profile: 23.7% were aged 25 years and below; 54.0% were aged 26-44 years; 16.9% were aged 45-64 years; and 4.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 34 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 121 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 17,506 persons identified with Iranian ancestry. Most of them were born in Iran (76.3%) and Australia (15.4%). A small proportion (13.6%) of the Iran-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 4.2% arrived in 1996-2000; 6.2% arrived in 2001-2005; 17.3% arrived in 2006-2010; and 56.1% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Iran-born speak Persian (77.0%) and Arabic (4.8%); 5.6% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 18.3% speak English not well/not at all. The Iran-born follow Islam (35.2%), Baha'i (9.5%), Catholic (2.5%) and Christian not further defined (2.2%); 30.1% have no religion. Two-fifths of the Iran-born (39.7%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Iran-born are higher than for total Victoria: 19.2% have a postgraduate degree and 21.0% have a bachelor degree, compared to 5.4% and 16.5% for total Victoria. Less of the Iran-born have a certificate (7.5%) and school education only (33.4%) compared to Victoria (14.4% and 38.7%).

The labour force participation rate of the Iran-born at 59.2% is similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 20.7% is much higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Iran-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of them work as professionals (37.4%) and technicians and trades workers (17.1%), compared to Victoria (23.3% and 13.1%). Less of them work as managers (9.3%), clerical and administrative workers (7.1%) and sales workers (6.1%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 13.3% and 9.7%).

The industry of employment patterns for the Iran-born are also fairly different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in construction (11.2%), professional, scientific, technical and administration (14.4%) and healthcare and social assistance (15.9%) than Victoria (8.3%, 11.4% and 12.5%). Less of them are employed in wholesale and retail trade (10.3%), accommodation and food services (4.6%) and public administration and safety (2.5%) than Victoria (13.4%, 6.6% and 5.3%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Iran-born is lower than total Victoria. More of them receive nil income (14.7%) and \$1-\$399 (28.4%), compared to 9.7% and 20.1% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$400-\$1,249 (33.1%) and \$1,250 and over (18.6%) than Victoria (39.8% and 21.1%).
