## The Iraq-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 18)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 18,637 Iraq-born persons in Victoria (27.7% of Australia's total), ranked 18th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Iraq-born increased by 45.7% (5,842) from 12,795 persons in 2011. Although the Iraq-born are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, they mainly live in the LGAs of Hume (57.1%), Whittlesea (12.4%), Moreland (3.9%), Casey (3.5%) and Brimbank (2.5%).

The Iraq-born reflected a balanced age profile: 24.3% were aged 25 years and below; 40.9% were aged 26-44 years; 27.9% were aged 45-64 years; and 6.9% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 37 years, similar to total Victoria. The gender ratio was 105 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 12,571 persons identified with Iraqi ancestry. Most of them were born in Iraq (62.7%) and Australia (27.4%). A small proportion (14.8%) of the Iraq-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 14.7% arrived in 1996-2000; 15.0% arrived in 2001-2005; 21.0% arrived in 2006-2010; and 31.9% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Iraq-born speak Arabic (43.8%), Chaldean (27.3%) and Assyrian (21.1%); 2.7% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 31.4% speak English not well/not at all. The Iraq-born are mainly Catholic (51.8%), Islam (27.9%), Assyrian Apostolic (6.5%) and Christian not further defined (4.4%). Almost two-thirds (62.8%) of the Iraq-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.







## **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Iraq-born are lower than for total Victoria: 16.7% have a bachelor degree or higher and 7.6% have a certificate, compared to 24.4% and 14.4% for Victoria. Half (51.3%) of the Iraq-born have school education only and 8.8% have no educational attainment, compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Iraq-born at 37.0% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 17.7% is higher than Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Iraq-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (6.7%), professionals (17.2%) and clerical and administrative workers (7.4%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 23.3% and 13.3%). More of them work as technicians and trades workers (19.2%), community and personal service workers (15.0%) and labourers (14.0%) than Victoria (13.1%, 10.6%, and 9.0%.

The industry of employment patterns for the Iraq-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. More of them are employed in construction (11.4%), transport, postal and warehousing (7.5%) and heathcare and social assistance (17.4%) compared to Victoria (8.3%, 4.8% and 12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Iraq-born is lower than total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (45.6%) than Victoria (20.1%). Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (9.0%) and \$1,250 or more (6.2%), compared to 16.7% and 21.1% for Victoria.
