

# The Italy-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 6)



At the 2016 Census, there were 70,527 Italy-born persons in Victoria (40.5% of Australia's total), ranked 6<sup>th</sup> among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Italy-born decreased by 8.3% (6,381) from 76,908 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Moreland (11.2%), Darebin (8.7%), Whittlesea (8.5%), Moonee Valley (6.8%) and Hume (4.6%); 10.7% live in regional Victoria.

The Italy-born reflected a significant ageing profile: 2.3% were aged 25 years and below; 6.0% were aged 26-44 years; 23.8% were aged 45-64 years; and 67.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 70 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 98 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 352,711 persons identified with Italian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (75.2%) and Italy (19.4%). Most (87.1%) of the Italy-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 0.7% arrived in 1996-2000; 0.8% arrived in 2001-2005; 1.4% arrived in 2006-2010; and 5.0% arrived in 2011-2016.

Four-fifths (80.5%) of the Italy-born speak Italian (80.5%); 17.8% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 19.7% speak English not well/not at all. Most (87.9%) of the Italy-born are Catholic; 5.7% have no religion. Nearly three-quarters of the Italy-born (73.7%) have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.



# **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Italy-born are lower than for total Victoria: 59.8% have school education only and 6.6% have no educational attainment, compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for total Victoria. Only 6.5% have a bachelor degree or higher (24.3% for Victoria).

The labour force participation rate of the Italy-born at 28.0% is much lower than for total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 4.4% is also lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Italy-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. More of them work as managers (15.5%), technicians and trades workers (18.4%) and labourers (12.0%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 13.1% and 9.0%). Less of them work as professionals (13.9%) compared to 23.3% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns for the Italy-born are also fairly similar to those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in construction (11.8%), accommodation and food services (10.2%) than Victoria (8.3% and 6.6%). Less of them are employed in education and training (6.6%) and heathcare and social assistance (8.0%) than Victoria (12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Italy-born is lower than for total Victoria. More of the Italy-born receive \$1-\$399 (37.4%) and \$400-\$799 (29.3%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for total Victoria. Less of the Italy-born receive \$800-\$1,249 (10.3%) and \$1,250 or more (9.6%), compared to Victoria (16.7% and 21.1%).
