## The Japan-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 40)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 8,515 Japan-born persons in Victoria (20.1% of Australia's total), ranked the 40<sup>th</sup> among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Japan-born increased by 24.9% (1,695) from 6,820 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Melbourne (12.9%), Glen Eira (7.8%), Monash (7.2%), Stonnington (4.7%) and Boroondara (4.7%); 7.5% live in regional Victoria.

The Japan-born reflected a young to mature age profile: 23.4 % were aged 25 years and below; 48.6% were aged 26-44 years; 21.1% were aged 45-64 years; and 6.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 37 years, similar to total Victoria. The gender ratio was 45 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 13,104 persons identified with Japanese ancestry. Most of them were born in Japan (58.4%) and Australia (32.3%). One-fifth (19.6%) of the Japan-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 11.3% arrived in 1996-2000; 15.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 17.3% arrived in 2006-2010; and 30.3% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (78.2%) of the Japan-born population speak Japanese; 17.5% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 14% speak English not well/not at all. One-fifth (20.1%) of the Japan-born follow Buddhism 3.6% are Catholic, 2.5% follow a number of Japanese Religions; 61.1% have no religion. Only 18.1% of the Japan-born have Australian Citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





## **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Japan-born are higher than for total Victoria: 9.4% have a postgraduate degree, 31.4% have a bachelor degree and 13.1% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2% for Victoria; 30.3% have school education only, compared to Victoria (38.7%).

The labour force participation rate of the Japan-born at 64.1% is slightly higher than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 7.2% is also slightly higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Japan-born are fairly different from those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (11.7%), technicians and trades workers (10.7%) and machinery operators and drivers (1.7%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 13.1% and 5.8%). More of them work as professionals (28.7%), community and personnel workers (19.6%) than Victoria (23.3% and 10.6%).

The industry of employment patterns for the Japan-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. Less of them are employed in construction (1.1%) and public administration and safety (1.8%) than Victoria (8.3% and 5.3%). More of them are employed in accommodation and food services (19.5%) and education and training (15.5%), compared to Victoria (6.6% and 8.6%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Japan-born is also fairly similar to total Victoria, with some exceptions. More of them (21.8%) receive nil income than Victoria (9.7%). Less of them (17.1%) receive \$1,249 or more, compared to 21.1% for Victoria.
