The Jordan-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 99)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 906 Jordan-born persons in Victoria (15.3% of Australia's total), ranked 99th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Jordan-born increased by 31.7% (218) from 688 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Hume (20.5%), Casey (10.4%), Whittlesea (7.8%), Moreland (5.0%) and Darebin (4.9%).

The Jordan-born reflected a young to mature age profile: 34.6 % were aged 25 years and below; 38.1% were aged 26-44 years; 21.6% were aged 45-64 years; and 5.6% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 33 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 120 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 788 persons identified with Jordanian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (41.0%), Jordan (37.6%) and Kuwait (5.8%). Over one-quarter (27.5%) of the Jordan-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 10.0% arrived in 1996-2000; 14.5% arrived in 2001-2005; 15.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 27.0% arrived in 2011-2016.

The Jordan-born speak mainly Arabic (79.8%), Assyrian (3.5%) and Chaldean (2.4%); 9.5% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 7.7% speak English not well/not at all. The Jordan-born follow a variety of religions: Islam (54.2%), Catholic (16.9%), Eastern Orthodox (9.1%) and Christian not further defined (3.1%); 6.3% have no religion. Over two-thirds (69.4%) have Australian Citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Jordan-born are higher than those for total Victoria. More of them (25.5%) have a bachelor degree, 14.7% have a postgraduate degree and 11.2% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 16.5%, 5.4% and 9.2% for Victoria. Less of them have a certificate (6.0%) and school education only (34.4%), compared to 14.4% and 38.7% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Jordan-born at 60.4% is similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 16.2% is higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Jordan-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. More of them (28.6%) are professionals compared to 23.3% for Victoria. Less of them are clerical and administrative workers (7.2%) and labourers (6.7%), compared to 13.3% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Jordan-born are also fairly similar to those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in professional, scientific, technical and administration (14.7%) and in education and training (10.3%), compared to 11.4% and 8.6% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Jordan-born is different from total Victoria. More of them receive nil income (19.4%) and \$1-\$399 (24.8%) compared to 9.7% and 20.1% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$400-\$799 (20.2%), \$800-\$1,249 (13.6%) and \$1,250-\$1,999 (8.9%), compared to 23.1%, 16.7% and 13.6% for Victoria.
