The Mexico-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 87)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 1,478 Mexico-born persons in Victoria (30.3% of Australia's total), ranked 87th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Mexico-born increased by 67.4% (595) from 883 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Melbourne (15.8%), Port Phillip (6.6%), Stonnington (5.5%), Moreland (4.9%) and Boroondara (4.8%).

The Mexico-born reflected a young to adult age profile: 20.3% were aged 25 years and under; 65.8% were aged 26-44 years; 12.0% were aged 45-64 years; and 2.3% were aged 65 and over. The median age was 33 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 91 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 2,117 persons identified with Mexican ancestry. Most of them were born in Mexico (54.9%) and Australia (25.7%). One-tenth (9.4%) of the Mexico-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 4.1% arrived in 1996-2000; 9.8% arrived in 2001-2005; 25.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 46.5% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (85.3%) of the Mexico-born speak Spanish; 12.6% speak English only. Over half of the Mexico-born are Catholic (56.6%) and 2.2% are Christian, not further defined; 30.2% have no religion. Two-fifths (42.4%) of the Mexico-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 53.8% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Mexico-born are higher than for total Victoria: 43% have a Bachelor Degree and 23.5% have a Postgraduate Degree, compared to 16.5% and 5.4% respectively. Less of the Mexico-born (16.5%) have school education only, compared to 38.7% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Mexico-born at 77.6% is higher than that for total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Mexico-born at 10.3% is also higher than for total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns are very different to those for total Victoria. More of the Mexico-born work as professionals (37.1%) and community & personal service workers (12.0%), compared to 23.3% and 10.6% for Victoria. Less of them are technicians & trades workers (8.9%), clerical & administrative workers (9.8%) and machinery operators & drivers (1.8%), compared to 13.1%, 13.3% and 5.8% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Mexico-born differ from those for total Victoria. Less of the Mexico-born are employed in agriculture, forestry, fishing & mining (0.7%), construction (2.7%) and healthcare & social assistance (7.0%), compared to 2.6%, 8.3% and 12.5% for Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (10.2%), accommodation & food services (16.7%) and professional, scientific, technical & administration (19.4%), compared to 7.8%, 6.6% and 11.4% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Mexico-born is different from total Victoria. More of the Mexico-born receive nil income (13.8%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (17.8%) and \$2,000 or more (10.2%), compared to 9.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. Less of the Mexico-born receive \$1-\$399 (18.1%) and \$400-\$799 (22.0%) compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria.
