## The New Zealand-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 4)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 93,253 New Zealand-born persons in Victoria (18.0% of Australia's total), ranked 4<sup>th</sup> among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The New Zealand-born increased by 16.2% (13,019) from 80,234 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with minor concentrations in the LGAs of Wyndham (8.3%) and Casey (7.6%); 16.3% live in regional Victoria.

The New Zealand-born reflected a balanced age profile: 26.3% were aged 25 years and under; 36.8% were aged 26-44 years; 28.2% were aged 45-64; and 8.8% were aged 65 and over. The median age was 37, similar to total Victoria. The gender ratio was 99 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 39,565 persons identified with New Zealander ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (53.2%) and New Zealand (42.0%). One-third (33.1%) of New Zealand-born arrived in Australia before 1996; 11.0% arrived in 1996-2000; 11.6% arrived in 2001-2005; 15.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 24.5% arrived in 2011-2016..

Most (85.7%) of the New Zealand-born speak English only; 4.3% speak Samoan; and 1.4% speak Maori. Almost half (45.6%) of the New-Zealand born have no religion; 13.0% are Catholic; 9.0% are Anglican; 4.8% are Christian not further defined; and 4.5% are Presbyterian/Reform. One-quarter (26.4%) of New Zealand-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born in Victoria





## **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the New Zealand-born are similar to those of total Victoria: 4.8% have a postgraduate degree; 17.3% have a bachelor degree; and 10.7% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2% for total Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the New Zealand-born at 76.2% is higher than total Victoria (60.5%). The unemployment rate for the New Zealand-born is slightly lower at 6.2% than for total Victoria (6.6%).

The occupational patterns of the New Zealand-born are similar to those for total Victoria. More of them work as managers (15.1%) and machinery operators & drivers (9.4%), compared to 13.5% and 5.8% for total Victoria. Less of them (7.5%) are sales workers compared to 9.7% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns for the New Zealand-born are very similar to total Victoria. Slightly fewer (6.2%) are employed in education compared to total Victoria (8.6%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the New Zealand-born is higher than that for total Victoria. More of them (22.2%) receive \$800-\$1,249; 19.1% receive \$1,250-\$1,999; and 11.1% receive \$2000 or more, compared to 16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. Less of them (20.8%) receive \$400-\$799 and 14.2% receive \$1,3399, compared to 23.1% and 20.1% for Victoria.
