The Papua New Guinea-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 73)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 2,611 Papua New Guinea-born persons in Victoria (9.1% of Australia's total), ranked 73rd among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Papua New Guinea-born increased by 3.0% (77) from 2,534 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with minor concentrations in Boroondara (3.8%), Brimbank (3.6%), Hume (3.5%) and Whitehorse (3.5%); 19.5% live in regional Victoria and 4.0% live in the regional LGA of Greater Geelong.

The Papua New Guinea-born reflected a balanced to adult age profile: 11.0% were aged 25 years and under; 40.7% were aged 26-44 years; 42.4% were aged 55-64 years; and 6.2% were aged 65 and older. The median age was 44 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 75 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 1,281 persons identified with Papua New Guinean ancestry. Most were born in Papua New Guinea (51.9%) and Australia (42.7%). Almost three-quarters (72.4%) of the Papua New Guinea-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia before 1996; 2.8% arrived in 1996-2000; 3.8% arrived in 2001-2005; 5.2% arrived in 2006-2010; and 11.0% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (82.3%) of Papua New Guinea-born speak English only; 6.7% speak Tok Pisin; and 4.0% speak Pidgin, not further defined. One-fifth (20.3%) of the Papua New Guinea-born are Catholic; 10.6% are Anglican; 7.1% are Uniting Church; 5.1% are Baptist; 29.6% have no religion. Four-fifths (79.5%) of the Papua New Guinea-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born in Victoria.

Distribution of Papua New Guinea-born, Top 5 LGAs: 2016 Census





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Papua New Guinea-born are higher than for total Victoria. One-quarter (24.6%) have a bachelor degree; 8.7% have a postgraduate degree; and 3.4% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 16.5%, 5.4% and 9.2% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Papua New Guinea-born at 74.6% is higher than total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate 7.2% is slightly higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Papua New- Guinea-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of them work as managers (16.8%) and professionals (30.5%) compared to 13.5% and 23.3% for Victoria. Less of them work as technicians & trades workers (9.8%), sales workers (5.6%) and labourers (6.6%), compared to 13.1%, 9.7% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns for the Papua New Guinea-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in professional, scientific, technical & administration (14.0%), public administration & safety (8.1%), education & training (12.9%) and healthcare & social assistance (17.2%), compared to 11.4%, 5.3%, 8.6% and 12.5% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in manufacturing (5.9%), construction (5.3%) and wholesale & retail trade (8.7%), compared to 7.8%, 8.3% and 13.4% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Papua New Guinea-born is different from total Victoria. More of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (18.7%) and \$2,000 or more (13.5%) compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. Less of them receive nil income (8.5%) and \$1-\$399 (14.6%) compared to 9.7% and 20.1% for Victoria.
