

The Romania-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 53)



At the 2016 Census, there were 5,423 Romania-born persons in Victoria (37.7% of Australia's total), ranked 53rd among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Romania-born increased by 1.2% (66) from 5,357 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentration in the LGA of Casey (25.5%) and minor concentrations in Greater Dandenong (6.8%), Wyndham (5.7%), Glen Eira (4.7%) and Brimbank (4.4%).

The Romania-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 6.4% were aged 25 years and under; 34.2% were aged 26-44; 40.3% were aged 45-64; and 18.9% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 48 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 91 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 9,156 persons identified with Romanian ancestry. Most of them were born in Romania (49.4%) and Australia (38.6%). Threefifths (59.8%) of the Romania-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 10.2% arrived in 1996-2000; 8.5% arrived in 2001-2005; 9.4% arrived in 2006-2010; and 9.8% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (66.4%) of the Romania-born speak Romanian and 7.4% speak Hungarian; 19.1% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 9.3% speak English not well/not at all. Over a quarter (28.2%) of the Romanian-born are Eastern Orthodox; 16.3% are Christian not further defined; 12.3% have no religion; 9.8% are Catholic; 8.6% are Baptist; and 8.2% are Pentecostal. Most (84.6%) of the Romania-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Romania-born are fairly similar to total Victoria: 7.4% have a postgraduate degree, 19.8% have a bachelor degree and 11.4% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2% for total Victoria. One-third (31.7%) have school education only, compared to 38.7% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Romania-born at 61.4% is similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Romania-born at 7.3% is slightly higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Romania-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. More of the Romania-born work as technicians and trades workers (16.7%) and machinery operators & drivers (9.5%) compared to 13.1% and 5.8% for Victoria. Less of the Romania-born are community & personal service workers (8.1%) and sales workers (5.4%) compared to 10.6% and 9.7% for Victoria.

The employment patterns of the Romania-born are fairly similar to total Victoria, with some exceptions: 12.7% of Romania-born are employed in manufacturing; and 15.3% are in construction, compared to 7.8% and 8.3% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in wholesale & retail trade (9.5%) and accommodation & food services (2.9%) compared to 13.4% and 6.6% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Romania-born is also fairly similar to total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (22.2%), \$800-\$1,249 (18.8%) and \$1,250-\$1,999 (15.6%) compared to 20.1%, 16.7% and 13.6% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$400-\$799 (22.0%) compared to 23.1% for total Victoria.
