The Serbia-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 46)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 7,304 Serbia-born persons in Victoria (36.2% of Australia's total), ranked 46th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Serbia-born decreased by 1.0% (77) from 7,381 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Casey (11.0%), Brimbank (9.9%), Greater Dandenong (8.1%), Wyndham (6.3%) and Melton (5.8%); 9.3% live in regional Victoria.

The Serbia-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 7.1% were aged 25 years and under; 22.1% were aged 26-44; 40.9% were aged 45-64; and 30.0% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 55 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 92 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 23,542 persons identified with Serbian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (44.3%), Serbia (24.5%), Bosnia & Herzegovina (9.2%), South Eastern Europe not further defined and Croatia (6.0%). Two-thirds (68.4%) of the Serbia-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 12.8% arrived in 1996-2000; 6.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 4.3% arrived in 2006-2010; and 5.5% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Serbia-born speak Serbian (70.7%), Hungarian (5.0%) and Slovak (3.1%); 13.8% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 14.8% speak English not well/not at all. Half (49.8%) of Serbia-born are Eastern Orthodox; 17.6% are Christian not further defined; and 10.7% are Catholic; 11.3% have no religion. Most (90.2%) of the Serbia-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the overseas-born in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Serbia-born are lower than total Victoria: 4.2% have a postgraduate degree; 11.9% have a bachelor degree; and 44.2% have a school education only, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 38.7% for total Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Serbia-born at 51.9% is lower than total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Serbiaborn at 6.4% is similar to total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Serbia-born are different to those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (11.5%), professionals (19.3%) and sales workers (7.4%) compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 9.7% for Victoria. More of them are technicians and trades workers (16.0%), machinery operators & drivers (10.2%), and labourers (12.6%), compared to 13.1%, 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The employment patterns of the Serbia-born are also different to those of total Victoria. More are employed in manufacturing (12.6%), construction (13.1%) and transport, postal & warehousing (7.7%), compared to 7.8%, 8.3% and 4.8% for Victoria. Less of them are in accommodation & food services (3.3%) and education & training (4.5%), compared to 6.6% and 8.6% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Serbia-born is lower than for total Victoria. Less of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (11.6%) and \$2,000 or more (5.4%), compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. More of the Serbia-born receive \$1-\$399 (29.3%) and \$400-\$799 (25.4%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria.
