# The Slovenia-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 76)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 2,172 Slovenia-born persons in Victoria (39.2% of Australia's total), ranked 76<sup>th</sup> among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Slovenia-born decreased by 10.8% (264) from 2,436 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in Brimbank (9.6%), Hume (4.9%), Moonee Valley (4.6%) and Manningham (4.5%); 11.4% of the Slovenia-born live in regional Victoria and 7.2% live in the regional LGA of Greater Geelong.

The Slovenia-born reflected a significantly ageing profile: 2.9% were aged 25 years and under; 8.7% were aged 26-44; 18.7% were aged 45-64; and 69.9% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 73 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 90 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 7,042 persons identified with Slovene ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (65.0%); 25.4% were born in Slovenia. Most (86.6%) of the Slovenia-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 2.0% arrived in 1996-2000; 1.0% arrived in 2001-2005; 2.0% arrived in 2006-2010; and 4.4% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Slovenia-born speak Slovene (52.9%), Italian (3.9%) and Croatian (3.5%); 30.8% speak English only. Three-quarters (77.4%) of the Slovenia-born are Catholic; 11.5% have no religion. Most (90.4%) of the Slovenia-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.





# **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Slovenia-born are significantly lower than for total Victoria: 2.2% have a postgraduate degree; 6.4% have a bachelor degree; and 5.9% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2%.

The labour force participation rate of the Slovenia-born at 25.3% is lower than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Slovenia-born at 4.2% is lower than for total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Slovenia-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. Less of the Slovenia-born are professionals (20.2%) and sales workers (6.9%), compared to 23.3% and 9.7% for total Victoria. More of them are machinery operators & drivers (8.3%) and labourers (12.1%), compared to 5.8% and 9.0%.

The employment patterns of the Slovenia-born are also similar to those of total Victoria. More of the Slovenia-born are employed in manufacturing (13.5%) and construction (11.5%), compared to 7.8% and 8.3% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in wholesale & retail trade (11.3%) and education & training (6.5%), compared to 13.4% and 8.6% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Slovenia-born is lower than for total Victoria. Less of the Slovenia-born receive \$800-\$1,249 (10.1%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (5.9%) and \$2,000 or more (3.1%), compared to 16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (36.5%) and \$400-\$799 (31.4%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria.
