# The South Africa-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 11)



# **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 27,184 South Africa-born persons in Victoria (16.7% of Australia's total), ranked 11<sup>th</sup> among the overseasborn communities in Victoria. The South Africa-born increased by 11.2% (2,738) from 24,446 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Glen Eira (11.8%), Casey (7.6%), Kingston (4.6%), Manningham (4.4%) and Wyndham (4.3%); 12.0% live in regional Victoria

The South Africa-born reflected a balanced age profile: 19.3% were aged 25 years and under; 34.1% were aged 26-44; 32.7% were aged 45-64; and 13.9% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 43 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 96 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 21,915 persons identified with South African ancestry. Most of them were born in South Africa (56.1%); 36.7% were born in Australia. One-third (35.0%) of the South Africa-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 12.9% arrived in 1996-2000; 15.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 19.3% arrived in 2006-2010; and 15.7% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (77.4%) of the South Africa-born speak English only; 18.1% speak Afrikaans. They follow a variety of religions: 12.6% are Anglican; 12.4% are Catholic; 12.2% are Jewish; 8.8% are Christian not further defined and 4.5% are Baptist; 21.4% have no religion. Three-quarters (74.4%) of the South Africa-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the overseas-born in Victoria.



# **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the South Africa-born are higher than those for total Victoria. More of them (9.3%) have a postgraduate degree, 28.6% have a bachelor degree and 15.6% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the South Africa-born at 75.3% is higher than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 5.5% is lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the South Africa-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of the South Africa-born are managers (18.3%) and professionals (36.4%), compared to 13.5% and 23.3% for Victoria. Less of them are technicians and trades workers (8.8%), machinery operators & drivers (2.0%) and labourers (3.7%), compared to 13.1%, 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the South Africa-born are similar to those for total Victoria, with some exceptions. Less of them (5.0%) are employed in construction; 4.2% are in accommodation & food services; and 2.8% are in transport, postal & warehousing, compared to 8.3%, 6.6% and 4.8% for Victoria. More of them are employed in finance & insurance (6.1%), professional, scientific, technical & administration (17.1%) and healthcare & social assistance (14.8%), compared to 3.9%, 11.4% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the South Africa-born is higher than total Victoria. More of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (19.7%) and \$2,000 or more (19.0%), compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$1-\$399 (14.5%) and \$400-\$799 (16.8%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria.
