## The Taiwan-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 37)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 9,900 Taiwan-born persons in Victoria (21.1% of Australia's total), ranked 37<sup>th</sup> among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Taiwan-born increased by 74.1% (4,214) from 5,686 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Melbourne (16.1%), Whitehorse (9.0%), Boroondara (8.2%), Monash (7.9%) and Manningham (7.2%); 13.2% live in regional Victoria.

The Taiwan-born reflected a young to balanced age profile: 21.3% were aged 25 years and under; 59.5% were aged 26-44; 14.9% were aged 45-64; and 4.3% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 31 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 69 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 3,852 persons identified with Taiwanese ancestry. Most of them were born in Taiwan (80.0%) and Australia (15.2%). One-fifth (20.3%) of the Taiwan-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 9.7% arrived in 1996-2000; 9.4% arrived in 2001-2005; 11.4% arrived in 2006-2010; and 41.1% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (89.9%) of the Taiwan-born speak Mandarin; 1.9% speak Min Nan; 5.1% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 29.4% speak English not well/not at all. One-fifth (21.1%) of the Taiwan-born are Buddhist; and 3.7% are Christian not further defined; 57.1% have no religion. Two-fifths (43.8%) of the Taiwan-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for the overseasborn in Victoria.





## **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Taiwan-born are higher than for total Victoria. More of them have a postgraduate degree (13.8%) and a bachelor degree (32.6%), compared to 5.4% and 16.5% for Victoria. Less of them have an advanced diploma or diploma (7.9%) and a certificate (3.3%), compared to 9.2% and 14.4% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Taiwan-born at 67.7% is higher than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Taiwan-born at 9.7% is also higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Taiwan-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of the Taiwan-born are managers (8.9%), technicians and trades workers (8.9%) and clerical & administrative workers (8.6%) than Victoria (13.5%, 13.1% and 13.3%). More of them are professionals (25.0%), community & personal service workers (14.1%) and labourers (22.6%) than Victoria (23.3%, 10.6% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns of the Taiwan-born are also different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (12.2%) and accommodation & food services (14.4%) than Victoria (7.8% and 6.6%). Less of them are employed in construction (2.3%), public admin & safety (2.1%) and education & training (5.6%) than Victoria (8.3%, 5.3% and 8.6%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Taiwan-born is lower than for total Victoria. More of them receive nil income (18.5%), \$1-\$399 (21.0%) and \$400-\$799 (27.5%), compared to Victoria (9.7%, 20.1% and 23.1%). Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (15.9%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (9.8%) and \$2,000 or more (5.0%), compared to Victoria (6.7%, 13.6% and 7.5%).
