The Thailand-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 26)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 15,979 Thailand-born persons in Victoria (24.1% of Australia's total), ranked 26th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Thailand-born increased by 48.4% (5,212) from 10,767 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Melbourne (10.9%), Wyndham (9.2%), Greater Dandenong (7.4%) and Casey (4.1%); 10.0% live in regional Victoria and 3.4% live in the regional LGA of Greater Geelong.

The Thailand-born reflected a young to adult profile: 34.5% were aged 25 years and under; 49.4% were aged 26-44; 14.2% were aged 45-64; and 2.0% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 31 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 52 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 15,000 persons identified with Thai ancestry. Most (72.8%) of them were born in Thailand; 22.5% were born in Australia. Almost one-fifth (17.3%) of the Thailand-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 6.7% arrived in 1996-2000; 10.9% arrived in 2001-2005; 24.8% arrived in 2006-2010; and 34.9% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Thailand-born speak Thai (60.2%), Karen (12.2%), Khmer (3.1%), Burmese (2.3%) and Vietnamese (1.1%); 17.1% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 17.6% speak English not well/not at all. Two-thirds (66.0%) of the Thailandborn are Buddhist; 7.1% are Baptist; 3.5% are Catholic; 2.9% are Anglican; and 2.6% are Muslim; 10.7% have no religion. Almost half (47.7%) of the Thailand-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Thailand-born are higher than for total Victoria. More of them have a postgraduate degree (9.5%) and a bachelor degree (24.9%), compared to 5.4% and 16.5% for Victoria. Less of them have an advanced diploma or diploma (8.7%) and a certificate (8.0%), compared to Victoria (9.2% and 14.4%).

The labour force participation rate of the Thailand-born at 64.2% is higher than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 10.0% is also higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Thailand-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them are managers (9.0%), professionals (11.1%) and clerical & administrative workers (8.8%), compared to Victoria (3.5%, 23.3% and 13.3%). More of them are technicians and trades workers (17.5%), community & personal service workers (22.3%) and labourers (9.0%), compared to Victoria (13.1%, 10.6% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns of the Thailand-born are also different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in accommodation & food services (30.6%) and health care & social assistance (15.0%), compared to Victoria (6.6% and 12.5%). Less of them are employed in construction (2.3%), wholesale & retail trade (8.9%) and education & training (3.6%), compared to Victoria (8.3%, 13.4% and 8.6%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Thailand-born is lower than total Victoria. More of them receive nil income (20.1%), \$1-\$399 (27.2%) and \$400-\$799 (25.2%), compared to 9.7%, 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (15.0%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (6.7%) and \$2,000 or more (2.4%), compared to 16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
