# The Timor-Leste-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 57)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 4,982 Timor-Leste-born persons in Victoria (53.9% of Australia's total), ranked 57<sup>th</sup> among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Timor-Leste-born increased by 0.3% (16) from 4,966 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Brimbank (18.0%), Casey (17.4%), Melton (10.1%), Greater Dandenong (8.7%) and Yarra (7.3%).

The Timor-Leste-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 4.0% were aged 25 years and under; 30.6% were aged 26-44; 48.4% were aged 45-64; and 17.1% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 50 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 98 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 4,354 persons identified with Timorese ancestry. Most of them were born in Timor-Leste (51.3%), Australia (43.9%) and Portugal (2.4%). Most (87.7%) of the Timor-Leste-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 4.8% arrived in 1996-2000; 1.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 1.6% arrived in 2006-2010; and 1.6% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Timor-Leste-born speak Hakka (60.3%), Mandarin (8.9%), Portuguese (5.8%), Tetum (5.4%) and Timorese (4.0%); 8.0% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 34.5% speak English not well/not at all. Almost half (46.5%) of the Timor-Leste-born are Catholic; 17.7% are Buddhist; and 3.6% are Christian not further defined; 22.3% have no religion. Most (94.4%) of the Timor-Leste-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.





#### **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Timor-Leste-born are lower than for total Victoria. Less of them (1.2%) have a postgraduate degree; 8.0% have a bachelor degree; and 6.0% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to Victoria (5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2%). More of them have school education only (57.5%) and no educational attainment (12.6%), compared to 38.7% and 1.0% for Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Timor-Leste-born at 60.2% is similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 6.2% is slightly lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Timor-Leste-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (10.3%), professionals (8.9%), technicians & trades workers (10.8%) and community & personal service workers (5.2%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 23.3%, 13.1% and 10.6%). More of them are machinery operators & drivers (20.8%) and labourers (26.0%), compared to 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Timor-Leste-born are also different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (23.3%), accommodation & food services (12.0%) and transport, postal & warehousing (8.9%), compared to Victoria (7.8%, 6.6% and 4.8%). Less of them are employed in construction (3.2%), professional, scientific, technical & administration (6.9%), education & training (2.6%) and health care & social assistance (6.7%), compared to Victoria (8.3%, 11.4%, 8.6% and 12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Timor-Leste-born is lower than total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (27.0%), \$400-\$799 (27.8%) and \$800-\$1,249 (20.5%), compared to 20.1%, 23.1% and 16.7% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (9.4%) and \$2,000 or more (2.5%), compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
