The Tonga-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 82)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 1,696 Tonga-born persons in Victoria (17.0% of Australia's total), ranked 82nd among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Tonga-born increased by 17.4% (251) from 1,445 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Wyndham (17.2%), Brimbank (14.0%), Mildura (9.2%), Swan Hill (7.8%) and Casey (4.8%).

The Tonga-born reflected an adult to mature age profile: 10.2% were aged 25 years and under; 34.9% were aged 26-44; 43.3% were aged 45-64; and 11.7% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 46 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 107 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 5,555 persons identified with Tongan ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (43.3%), New Zealand (25.7%) and Tonga (25.6%). Two-fifths (41.5%) of the Tonga-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 11.2% arrived in 1996-2000; 7.7% arrived in 2001-2005; 13.0% arrived in 2006-2010; and 20.3% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (81.8%) of the Tonga-born speak Tongan; 14.8% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 10.0% speak English not well/not at all. One-fifth (22.2%) of the Tonga-born are Uniting Church; 16.3% are Catholic; 15.9% are Other Protestant; 11.8% are Latter-day Saints; 10.7% are Christian not further defined; 4.4% have no religion. Almost two-fifths (44.0%) of the Tonga-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Tonga-born are lower than for total Victoria. Less of them (2.0%) have a postgraduate degree; 5.7% have a bachelor degree; and 8.4% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to Victoria (5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2%). More of them have school education only (56.3%) and no educational attainment (2.3%), compared to Victoria (38.7% and 1.0%).

The labour force participation rate of the Tonga-born at 60.6% is similar to total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 12.5% is higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Tonga-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of them work as managers (4.4%), professionals (10.9%), clerical & administrative workers (6.8%) and sales workers (1.5%), compared to Victoria (13.5%, 23.3%, 13.3% and 9.7%). More of them work as machinery operators & drivers (28.2%) and labourers (19.5%), compared to Victoria (5.8% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns of the Tonga-born are also different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in agriculture, forestry, fishing & mining (7.1%), manufacturing (16.1%), transport, postal & warehousing (12.9%), compared to Victoria (2.6%, 7.8% and 4.8%). Less of them are employed in construction (5.9%), wholesale & retail trade (6.2%) and education & training (3.9%), compared to Victoria (8.3%, 13.4% and 8.6%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Tonga-born is different from total Victoria. More of them receive nil income (12.0%), \$400-\$799 (29.4%) and \$800-\$1,249 (21.5%), compared to 9.7%, 23.1% and 16.7% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (8.7%) and \$2,000 or more (2.0%), compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
