The Ukraine-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 55)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 5,322 Ukraine-born persons in Victoria (39.8% of Australia's total), ranked 55th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Ukraine-born decreased by 9.3% (548) from 5,870 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Glen Eira (25.2%), Kingston (9.6%), Port Phillip (9.3%), Bayside (7.2%) and Stonnington (5.4%)

The Ukraine-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 6.2% were aged 25 years and under; 29.7% were aged 26-44; 28.4% were aged 45-64; and 35.5% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 54 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 73 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 8,529 persons identified with Ukrainian ancestry. Most of them were born in Australia (56.5%), Ukraine (20.8%) and Germany (5.8%). Three-fifths (60.7%) of the Ukraine-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 11.3% arrived in 1996-2000; 8.1% arrived in 2001-2005; 8.1% arrived in 2006-2010; and 9.3% arrived in 2011-2016.

Almost two-thirds (64.2%) of the Ukraine-born speak Russian; 19% speak Ukrainian; 12.3% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 19.3% speak English not well/not at all. Over a quarter (28.7%) of the Ukraine-born are Jewish; 18.5% are Eastern Orthodox; 10.2% are Catholic; and 7.2% are Christian not further defined; 26.5% have no religion. Most (84.8%) of the Ukraine-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Ukraine-born are higher than for total Victoria. More of them (9.7%) have a postgraduate degree; 28.6% have a bachelor degree; and 13.7% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to Victoria (5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2%). Less of them have a certificate (9.3%) and school education only (24.4%), compared to Victoria (14.4% and 38.0%).

The labour force participation rate of the Ukraine-born at 53.3% is lower than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 6.2% is slightly lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Ukraine-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. More of them are professionals (34.9%), compared to 23.3% for Victoria. Less of them are clerical & administrative workers (11.2%), sales workers (7.8%) and labourers (5.4%), compared to Victoria (13.3%, 9.7% and 9.0%).

The industry of employment patterns of the Ukraine-born are also fairly similar to total Victoria. Less of them are employed in wholesale & retail trade (11.4%); accommodation & food services (3.5%); and finance & insurance (5.8%), compared to Victoria (13.4%, 6.6% and 3.9%). More of them are employed in professional, scientific, technical & administration (15.6%) and healthcare & social assistance (16.3%), compared to Victoria (11.4% and 12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Ukraine-born is slightly lower than total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (26.4%) and \$400-\$799 (27.4%) than Victoria (20.1% and 23.1%). Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (14.3%) and \$1,250-\$1,999 (12.8%), compared to Victoria (16.7% and 13.6%).
