The Uruguay-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 84)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 1,605 Uruguay-born persons in Victoria (17.8% of Australia's total), ranked 84th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Uruguay-born decreased by 0.6% (9) from 1,614 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Brimbank (14.4%), Casey (11.5%), Wyndham (5.9%), Melton (5.7%) and Greater Dandenong (5.0%).

The Uruguay-born reflected a mature to ageing profile: 2.4% were aged 25 years and under; 21.1% were aged 26-44; 40.6% were aged 45-64; and 35.6% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 56 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 90 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 1,459 persons identified with Uruguayan ancestry. Most (56.3%) of them were born in Australia; 39.1% were born in Uruguay. Most (87.3%) of the Uruguay-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 1.7% arrived in 1996-2000; 2.7% arrived in 2001-2005; 2.7% arrived in 2006-2010; and 3.1% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Uruguay-born speak Spanish (79.2%); 17.0% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 16.1% speak English not well/not at all. Over half (57.8%) of the Uruguay-born are Catholic; 4.0% are Christian, not further defined; 25.5% have no religion. Most (91.4%) of the Uruguay-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Uruguay-born are lower than for total Victoria. Less of them (3.0%) have a postgraduate degree and 8.8% have a bachelor degree, compared Victoria (5.4% and 16.5%). More of them have a certificate (18.4%) and school education only (45.0%), compared to Victoria (14.4% and 38.7%).

The labour force participation rate of the Uruguay-born at 51.2% is lower than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 5.9% is slightly lower than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Uruguay-born are fairly different from those for total Victoria. Less of the Uruguay-born work as managers (11.1%), professionals (15.6%) and sales workers (6.3%), compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 9.7% for Victoria. More of them work as technicians and trades workers (17.3%), machinery operators & drivers (9.8%) and labourers (14.1%), compared to 13.1%, 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Uruguay-born are fairly similar to those for total Victoria. Less of the Uruguay-born are employed in wholesale & retail trade (9.7%) and accommodation & food services (3.8%), compared to 13.4% and 6.6% for Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (12.3%), public administration & safety (7.3%) and health care & social assistance (14.5%), compared to 7.8%, 5.3% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Uruguay-born is lower than for total Victoria. More of them receive \$1-\$399 (28.7%) and \$400-\$799 (28.2%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for total Victoria. Less of them receive \$1,250-\$1,999 (12.7%) and \$2,000 or more (3.9%), compared to 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria.
