## The Venezuela-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 91)



## **Demographic characteristics**

At the 2016 Census, there were 1,267 Venezuela-born persons in Victoria (17.8% of Australia's total), ranked 91st among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Venezuela-born increased by 74.5% (541) from 726 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Melbourne (8.1%), Port Phillip (7.2%), Boroondara (6.5%), Darebin (5.2%) and Moreland (5.2%).

The Venezuela-born reflected a young to adult age profile: 18.3% were aged 25 years and under; 65.8% were aged 26-44; 14.2% were aged 45-64; and 1.9% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 33 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 100 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 913 persons identified with Venezuelan ancestry. Most of them were born in Venezuela (76.5%) and Australia (17.6%). A small proportion (11.4%) of the Venezuela-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 4.0% arrived in 1996-2000; 4.8% arrived in 2001-2005; 27.2% arrived in 2006-2010; and 49.6% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most (83.3%) of the Venezuela-born speak Spanish (83.8%); 10.6% speak English only. Two-thirds (66.9%) of the Venezuela-born are Catholic; 19.3% have no religion. Over two-fifths (43.0%) of the Venezuela-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.







## **Economic characteristics**

The education levels of the Venezuela-born are higher than for total Victoria. More of them (18.8%) have a postgraduate degree; and 46.6% have a bachelor degree, compared to Victoria (5.4% and 16.5%). Less of them have a certificate (4.9%) and school education only (13.6%), compared to Victoria (14.4% and 38.7%).

The labour force participation rate of the Venezuela-born at 85.4% is higher than that of total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 8.4% is also higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Venezuela-born are different from those for total Victoria. Less of the Venezuela-born work as managers (10.0%), clerical & administrative workers (9.7%) and sales workers (5.2%), compared to 13.5%, 13.3% and 9.7% for total Victoria. More of the Venezuela-born are professionals (34.6%) and labourers (13.2%), compared to 23.3% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Venezuela-born are also different from those for total Victoria. More of the Venezuela-born are employed in manufacturing (10.5%), accommodation & food services (13.9%) and professional, scientific, technical & administration (23.7%), compared to 7.8%, 6.6% and 11.4% for Victoria. Less of them are employed in construction (4.6%), wholesale & retail trade (8.9%) and health care & social assistance (7.8%), compared to 8.3%, 13.4% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Venezuela-born is higher than that of total Victoria. More of the Venezuela-born receive \$800-\$1,249 (17.7%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (19.1%) and \$2,000 or more (10.2%), compared to 16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for Victoria. Less of them receive \$1-\$399 (18.9%) and \$400-\$799 (21.4%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria.
