The Vietnam-Born Community in Victoria – 2016 Census (ranked 5)

VICTORIA State Government

Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 80,787 Vietnam-born persons in Victoria (36.8% of Australia's total), ranked 5th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Vietnam-born increased by 18.3% (12,491) from 68,296 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with major concentrations in the LGAs of Brimbank (26.9%), Greater Dandenong (16.4%), Maribyrnong (9.5%), Whittlesea (4.0%) and Monash (3.5%).

The Vietnam-born reflected a balanced to mature age profile: 13.2% were aged 25 years and under; 36.5% were aged 26-44; 40.1% were aged 45-64; and 10.1% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 45 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 81 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 108,142 persons identified with Vietnamese ancestry. Most of them were born in Vietnam (59.8%) and Australia (36.0%). Over half (56.7%) of the Vietnam-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 6.6% arrived in 1996-2000; 5.7% arrived in 2001-2005; 11.3% arrived in 2006-2010; and 15.9% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Vietnam-born speak Vietnamese (83.0%); 10.7% speak Cantonese; 3.3% speak English only. Of those who speak a language other than English, 39.8% speak English not well/not at all. Almost half (47.1%) of the Vietnam-born are Buddhist; 19.6% are Catholic; 25.7% have no religion. Three-quarters (75.0%) of the Vietnam-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.





Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Vietnam-born are lower than for total Victoria. Less of them (3.9%) have a postgraduate degree; 0.9% have a graduate diploma or graduate certificate; 16.5% have a bachelor degree; and 6.8% have a certificate, compared to Victoria (5.4%, 2.5%, 16.5% and 14.4%). More of them have school education only (52.3%) and no educational attainment (6.8%), compared to Victoria (38.7% and 1.0%).

The labour force participation rate of the Vietnam-born at 60.4% is similar to that of total Victoria at 60.5%. Their unemployment rate at 11.7% is higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Vietnam-born are different from those for total Victoria. More of them (13.2%) are machinery operators & drivers and 19.2% are labourers, compared to 5.8% and 9.0% for Victoria. Less of them are managers (8.6%), professionals (15.9%) and clerical & administrative workers (9.3%), compared to 13.5%, 23.3% and 13.3% for Victoria.

The industry of employment patterns of the Vietnam-born are also different from those for total Victoria. More of them are employed in manufacturing (19.9%), accommodation & food services (9.6%) and arts, recreation & other services (7.7%), compared to Victoria (7.8%, 6.6% and 5.5%). Less of them are employed in construction (3.3%), professional, scientific, technical & administration (8.4%) and health care & social assistance (7.6%), compared to Victoria (8.3%, 11.4% and 12.5%).

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Vietnam-born is lower than total Victoria. More of the Vietnam-born receive nil income (16.0%), \$1-\$399 (28.0%) and \$400-\$799 (24.2%), compared to Victoria (9.7%, 20.1% and 23.1%). Less of them receive \$800-\$1,249 (15.8%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (8.7%) and \$2,000 or more (3.6%), compared to Victoria (16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5%).
