The Zimbabwe-Born Community in Victoria — 2016 Census (ranked 58)



Demographic characteristics

At the 2016 Census, there were 4,694 Zimbabwe-born persons in Victoria (13.5% of Australia's total), ranked 58th among the overseas-born communities in Victoria. The Zimbabwe-born increased by 24.2% (914) from 3,780 persons in 2011. They are distributed throughout Metropolitan Melbourne, with concentrations in the LGAs of Casey (10.5%), Whittlesea (7.6%), Wyndham (6.1%), Frankston (3.9%) and Whitehorse (3.5%); 15.2% of Zimbabwe-born in Victoria live in regional Victoria.

The Zimbabwe-born reflected a balanced age profile: 19.8% were aged 25 years and under; 47.0% were aged 26-44; 27.2% were aged 45-64; and 6.0% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 38 years, compared to 37 years for total Victoria. The gender ratio was 93 males to 100 females, compared to 96 males to 100 females for total Victoria.

There were 2,805 persons identified with Zimbabwean ancestry. Most of them were born in Zimbabwe (64.0%), Australia (24.6%), England (4.2%) and South Africa (3.3%). One-fifth (18.6%) of Zimbabwe-born in Victoria had arrived in Australia prior to 1996; 5.8% arrived in 1996-2000; 19.3% arrived in 2001-2005; 32.6% arrived in 2006-2010; and 21.8% arrived in 2011-2016.

Most of the Zimbabwe-born speak English only (50.0%), Shona (39.6%) and Ndebele (3.7%). Almost one-fifth (17.1%) of Zimbabwe-born are Catholic; 14.7% have no religion; 13.9% are Christian, not further defined; 12.3% are Pentecostal; and 11.8% are Anglican. Two-thirds (64.4%) of Zimbabwe-born have Australian citizenship, compared to 58.3% for overseas-born in Victoria.







Economic characteristics

The education levels of the Zimbabwe-born are higher than for total Victoria: 11.5% have a postgraduate degree; 3.6% have a grad diploma or grad certificate; and 31.9% have a bachelor degree and 18.3% have an advanced diploma or diploma, compared to 5.4%, 16.5% and 9.2% for total Victoria.

The labour force participation rate of the Zimbabwe-born at 82.6% is also higher than total Victoria at 60.5%. The unemployment rate for the Zimbabwe-born at 6.8% is slightly higher than total Victoria at 6.6%.

The occupational patterns of the Zimbabwe-born are different to those for total Victoria. The Zimbabwe-born are underrepresented in all but two occupations. More of the Zimbabwe-born are professionals (40.5%) and community & personal service workers (15.3%), compared to 23.3% and 10.6% for total Victoria. Less are technicians and trades workers (7.3%), sales workers (5.9%) and labourers (4.7%), compared to 13.1%, 9.7% and 9.0% for Victoria.

The employment patterns of the Zimbabwe-born are also different to those for total Victoria. Less of the Zimbabwe-born are employed in construction (3.2%), wholesale & retail trade (8.4%) and accommodation & food services (4.1%), compared to 8.3%, 13.4% and 6.6% for total Victoria. More of the Zimbabwe-born are employed in finance & insurance (6.9%) and health care & social assistance (31.1%), compared to 3.9% and 12.5% for Victoria.

The weekly personal income distribution pattern for the Zimbabwe-born is higher than total Victoria. More of the Zimbabwe-born receive \$800-\$1,249 (20.9%), \$1,250-\$1,999 (25.6%) and \$2,000 or more (13.6%), compared to 16.7%, 13.6% and 7.5% for total Victoria. Less of them receive \$1-\$399 (11.7%) and \$400-\$799 (15.2%), compared to 20.1% and 23.1% for Victoria.
