The public display of the Nazi Hakenkreuz symbol is now banned.

The public display of

the sacred Swastika

is not banned.

From 29 December 2022, it will be a criminal offence to intentionally publicly display the Nazi Hakenkreuz symbol. This symbol is now banned and punishable with up to 12 months in prison and/or a \$22,000 fine.

The Nazi Hakenkreuz symbol is the most widely known Nazi symbol.

For thousands of years the Swastika has been used by Hindu, Buddhist and Jain communities for cultural and religious purposes. The sacred Swastika is not banned and may continue to be used for genuine cultural and religious purposes.
