TIPS FOR KIDS

Visiting our state forests and parks can be fun! Even more fun if you're camping with family and friends. It's important to follow all the rules to keep the environment and each other safe.

How to make a safe campfire:

- Always bring enough firewood from home. Chopping down trees or taking logs in our forests and parks is not allowed.
- Keep the three metre area around your campfire clear of things that can catch fire, like leaves and sticks, your tent and clothes.
- Build your campfire in a fireplace or dig a 30cm deep hole.
- Make sure your fire isn't too big and all the wood you use is smaller than one metre.

- Keep at least two large buckets of water nearby to put out your fire when you leave the campsite or go to bed.
- Make sure an adult is always watching the fire. Campfires can escape quickly and cause bushfires.
- Call 136 186 to report unattended campfires and 000 to report a bushfire.

Did you see a native animal?

- How exciting! You can take a photo, but don't get too close, touch it, hurt it or scare it.
- Don't feed it any of your snacks.
- Tell an adult to call CrimeStoppers Victoria on 1800 333 000 if you see someone hurting wildlife or trying to take it home.

Other tips

Take all your rubbish home with you.

Set up camp 20 metres away from a waterway.

If you're washing dishes with soap, keep 50 metres away from the waterway.
