
## Gifts, Benefits and Hospitality

## **Scenario 2**

You can accept the GBH offer subject to certain Conditions.\* See below.

There is no need to declare on the Gift Register.

\*Conditions - Integrity test (see page 7 of the GBH Policy for the full list).

With the exception of beverages or sandwiches over a lunchtime contract management meeting or invitations to free seminars on legitimate business topics, individuals must refuse all other GBH offers:

- made by a current or prospective supplier regardless of the monetary value
- made during a procurement or tender process by a person or organisation involved in the process
- made by a person or organisation that may be seeking or receiving a State government grant
- made by a person or organisation involved in government recruitment
- of money, or used in a similar way to money, or easily converted to money
- that are bribes or inducements
- that give rise to a conflict of interest (actual, potential or perceived)
- that compromise public trust or do not align with community expectations
- NOTE: all accepted official gifts (\$50 and above) are to be declared. Declined official gifts, regardless of the monetary value, are not required to be declared.

The Gifts Register will be published on the Department's website each financial year as required by the minimum accountabilities under the Assistant Treasurer Standing Directions (2018).
